



For in the night in which he was betrayed, he took bread; and when he had given thanks, he brake it, and gave it to his disciples, saying, "Take, eat, this is my Body, which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me."

Wherefore, O Lord and heavenly Father, according to the institution of thy dearly beloved Son our Savior Jesus Christ, we, thy humble servants, do celebrate and make here before thy divine Majesty, with these thy holy gifts, which we now offer unto thee, the memorial thy Son hath commanded us to make; having in remembrance his blessed passion and precious death, his mighty resurrection and glorious ascension; rendering unto thee most hearty thanks for the innumerable benefits procured unto us by the same.

And we most humbly beseech thee, O merciful Father, to hear us; and, of thy almighty goodness, vouchsafe to bless and sanctify, with thy Word and Holy Spirit, these thy gifts and creatures of bread and wine; that we, receiving them according to thy Son our Savior Jesus Christ's holy institution, in remembrance of his death and passion, may be partakers of his most blessed Body and Blood.

And we earnestly desire thy fatherly goodness mercifully to accept this our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving; most humbly beseeching thee to grant that, by the merits and death of thy Son Jesus Christ, and through faith in his blood, we, and all thy whole Church, may obtain remission of our sins, and all other benefits of his passion.

And here we offer and present unto thee, O Lord, ourselves, our souls and bodies, to be a reasonable, holy, and living sacrifice unto thee; humbly beseeching thee that we, and all others who shall be partakers of this Holy Communion, may worthily receive the most precious Body and Blood of thy Son Jesus Christ, be filled with thy

grace and heavenly benediction, and made one body with him, that he may dwell in us, and we in him. And although we are unworthy, through our manifold sins, to offer unto thee any sacrifice, yet we beseech thee to accept this our bounden duty and service, not weighing our merits, but pardoning our offenses, through Jesus Christ our Lord; by whom, and with whom, in the unity of the Holy Ghost, all honor and glory be unto thee, O Father Almighty, world without end. 100th Annual Whitsunday Pilgrimage: St. John's, Ashwood at 10:00 AM on May 23

We are thrilled to announce the return of one of the Diocese of Tennessee's oldest traditions. On Sunday, May 23rd at 10:00 AM, we will again return to historic St. John's, Ashwood (six miles south of St. Peter's at Highway 243 and Polk Lane) to celebrate and give thanks for the Descent of the Holy Spirit on Jesus' Disciples at Pentecost (Acts 2) and on each of us at our Baptism.

The Rt. Rev. Brian Cole, the fifth Bishop of the Episcopal Diocese of East Tennessee, will Celebrate the Holy Communion, preach, and administer the Rite of Confirmation.

We are especially excited to anticipate the return of our Children's Choir and our Adult Choir for their first musical offerings in over a year.

Immediately after the service, the congregation will process to the graves of the Episcopal bishops buried on site for prayers and blessings.

We will also return to our tradition of the Whitsunday Picnic. St. Peter's will provide water and lemonade. We encourage those who would like to join us to bring their own lunch, lawn chairs, and/or blanket. St. John's Board will provide portable restroom facilities.

Thirty-four people are scheduled to be Confirmed, Received, or to reaffirm their Baptismal Vows. That is the largest group on one day in fifty years. We give thanks to God! And we should expect the church to be filled to capacity.

Remember that there is no running water at the church and the only air-conditioning is what passes through the open side windows. Please plan accordingly.
