FROM THE DESK OF THE RECTOR

Lent Madness

A couple of years ago, a friend and colleague recommended that I check out a growing phenomenon in the Episcopal internet world: Lent Madness.

Loosely based on the NCAA basketball tournaments every March, Lent Madness offers a daily devotional that combines history, theology, competition, and tongue-in-cheek humor. Every weekday throughout Lent, thirty-two saints "battle" to win the "coveted" Golden Halo. Participants visit daily the website www.lentmadness.org to learn about the saintly pair of the day and, in a 24-hour span, vote to determine who will "advance" to the next round. Sixteen saints make it to the Round of the Saintly Sixteen; eight advance to the Round of the Elate Eight; four make it to the Faithful Four; two to the Championship; and the winner is awarded the Golden Halo.

The first round consists of basic biographical information about each of the 32 saints. As saints progress, subsequent rounds feature quotes, quirky stories, legends, and other surprising and often humorous facts. You can find a copy of this year's bracket in this newsletter; you can also print your own copies and find other resources on the Lent Madness website. The competition kicks off on Ash Wednesday, February 27 and ends on Wednesday in Holy Week, April 8.

Lent Madness began in 2010 as the brainchild of the Rev. Tim Schenck, an Episcopal priest and rector of St. John's Church in Hingham, Massachusetts who sought a fun, engaging way for people to learn about the men and women who make up the church's calendar of saints. In 2012, Schenck partnered with Forward Movement (the same folks that publish *Forward Day by Day*) executive director Scott Gunn, to bring Lent Madness to a larger audience.

FROM THE DESK OF THE RECTOR (CONTINUED)

It may seem strange to focus on saints during the penitential season of Lent in which we are usually encouraged to embrace a new spiritual habit or surrender a personal pleasure. But the Christian life, while always personal, is never solitary or individualistic. Learning about the lives of the saints makes us aware of the "cloud of witnesses" that surround and encourage us in our common life in the love of God.

This year, Lent Madness features an intriguing slate of saints ancient and modern, Biblical and ecclesiastical. This year's saints include heavyweights such as Patrick, Harriet Tubman, Clare of Assisi, Hildegaard of Bingen, Joseph, and Jude, along with many lesser known yet equally inspiring people of faith.

These ancient figures from Scripture, famous spiritual heroes, and contemporary personalities served as beacons of God's light in their time and even our own. After all, as the children's hymn sings:

The lived not only in ages past
There are hundreds and thousands still;
The world is bright with the joyous saints who love to do Jesus will.
You can meet them in school, or in lanes, or at seas;
In church, or in trains, or in shops, or at tea;
For the saints of God are just folk like me,
And I mean to be one too.
