
ST. PETER'S PLEDGE DRIVE GIVE TO GROW IN LOVE

The "pledging season" of our Stewardship Education Program began on October 20th. As of Thursday, October 31st, we have received 36 pledges. Thank you! We are well on our way to our goal of 80% of our households giving to God through St. Peter's with a pledge.

By our best estimate, St. Peter's is comprised of 188 households which are either members or consistent worshippers. Of those, 113 (60%) make an annual pledge to support our work with God; 75 (40%) do not.

St. Peter's receives every gift with gratitude; at the same time, the commitment of a pledge offers several benefits: Spiritually, regular giving instills and deepens an awareness that God is involved in every day of our life. Emotionally and relationally, consistent giving helps members of a community feel a sense of belonging and connection.

Our goal for 2020 is to encourage 80% of our membership to make a commitment to pledge.
